Council Bugle Report

Bethany Christian Reformed Church

Meeting: Monday, 18 November 2013

- Chairman Tim VanHoffen opened with welcome and greetings. Scripture reading from 2 Corinthians 4. A discussion and devotional time included a reflection on Pastor Colin's sermon - God's design for church and community that glorifies himself. The inclusion of broken, flawed people, placed purposefully within the body of Christ to reveal God's glory. Time spent in prayers of praises, intercession and thanksgiving.

- Council and members of the search team engaged in a time of sharing and analyzing the time spent with Pastor Colin VanderPloeg and his wife Anita to determine possible next steps. The weekend proved quite beneficial as a means of getting to know Pastor Colin and his wife. The conversation with full council on Saturday afternoon, the town hall meeting with members and the worship service Sunday, allowed for extensive opportunity to explore the important things relating to their ministry and the ministries taking place at Bethany. Motion: "That we present Pastor Colin VanderPloeg to the congregation for a call" 2nd. Discussion. Many positive comments from members of the congregation and a general feeling that God is placing his hand of blessing on this connection between Pastor and congregation. A number of challenging questions were presented to Pastor Colin that allowed for an honest glimpse into his heart on things that matter to Bethany. Through our dialogue it became quite clear that there are many areas where we share important common ground. Included in our time together was opportunity to wonder about what God has in store for the future of Bethany and the ministries that we are a part of. Motion carried. Council senses God's leading in the process to date and particularly Pastor Colin as a strong choice to provide the servant leadership that is needed. Council has determined that voting will take place on Sunday, 24 November 2013. Each elder will call their district members to inform them of the planned voting and answer any inquiries they may have. The search team was thanked for their work to date. Council spent time in prayer for God's blessing on Pastor Colin, his wife and family, and the members of Bethany as we seek God's will in this.

- The search team was thanked once again for their work. A few of the members will be part of Sunday's ballot counting team along with some elders.

- Chairman Tim dismissed the search team members and the council meeting continued.

- Minutes from Council meeting held 16 October 2013 received. Motion to accept as presented. 2nd. Carried.

- Matters arising from the minutes. Discussed format, agenda and presentation of the 2014 Ministry Plan for the upcoming congregational meeting to be held Tuesday, 26 November 2013 @ 8:00 pm. Included in the new plan is one additional staff position (Youth Ministry Coordinator) at 8 hours per week. Council welcomes inquiries and discussion on this item and will be prepared to explain the rationale for this additional position and some of the expectations. There are a number of key areas that bolster the need to make critical investment in the area of youth ministry. Reference to the Hemorrhaging Faith study has reinforced the need to take a proactive approach to youth ministry and make the necessary investment to youth programs for the sake of our youth and young adults. Finding ways to make seamless transitions for our children from GEMS, Cadets, to MERGE and Konnect 20 would be one of the goals of the Youth Ministry Coordinator. In addition council weighed in the sentiments of Pastor Peter Hogeterp who wrote the following in his analysis within the Final Transition Report (Section E, #3); "There is considerable concern for our young people. Without a Youth Advisory Team or any other group especially charged with including our youth into the fabric of the church, we are losing them. This includes our college age young adults. A strategy needs to be developed that ensures incorporating the needs and the gifts of that segment of the church membership."

- Council Executive Report - no report.

- Deacons Report - no report.

- Finance Team Report - Financial reports for 31 October 2013 were reviewed. A concern raised that if we had been compensating a pastor this past year we would be in a slight operating deficit at this time. Council is thankful for faithful giving and for effective ministry that glorifies God as a result.

- Fellowship Team Report - no report.

- Buildings and Grounds Team report received for information. The team has asked for council to provide input on best way to enhance visibility, safety and signage in front of the church property. Motion: "To remove as necessary the trees closest to the road in front of the church property". 2nd. Discussion. Although our tendency to preserve all and any trees is a general feeling, the trees in question are hindering the church's visibility from the road which is problematic especially for visitors. Added to that is the fact that our current signage is ineffective and should be part of the rework. Landscape enhancements including new tree planting is an ongoing part of the property maintenance and at times larger steps need to be taken. Motion called. Carried.

- Safe Church Team Report received for information. Follow up on completed police clearance checks continue to be cumbersome. The safe church team has been asked to provide the names of individuals who are required to have current police clearances in place and have not completed them yet. The elders will enter into discussion with these individuals as our commitment to the culture of a safe church, especially as it relates to children and others who may be vulnerable. Council reiterates that a safe church is everyone's responsibility and is accomplished in many ways including education, awareness, policy, procedures and due diligence including police clearances. An emergency action plan will be developed to provide guidance in the event of an emergency. The preparation of this plan is to be the responsibility of stakeholders such as Ushers, Children's Ministry Coordinator and the Buildings and Grounds Team.

- Bethany Summer Day Camp Report received for information. Many blessings were highlighted following the completion of another successful day camp. Plans for 2014 that include key staffing as well as student hires is currently in the works. Council would like to especially thank Lindsay Janssens for the leadership that she has provided for this important ministry outreach.

- Correspondence Report received for information with appropriate action with incoming and outgoing correspondence.

- Membership. Templeman, Brian, Melanie and Matthew. Received a statement of membership from First CRC, Thunder Bay, Ontario. Council welcomes the Templeman's into our membership. This family is assigned to district #3. Elder Kevin Twomey and Deacon Peter Bulk.

- Transition Process Followup. #3 Mutual Care - Council studied and discussed this portion of the final report with possible steps of action.

- Miscellaneous.

1. Concern was raised regarding children in the sanctuary following the morning service. Many times the children lack parental supervision and are potentially handling expensive musical instruments and sound equipment. Council has determined that the best way to avoid costly, unnecessary repairs and replacement of instruments and equipment is to disallow the children in the sanctuary following the service. The ushers and/or caretakers will close the glass doors following the service. Council is also mindful that often the sanctuary is a place for members to go to for quiet conversation and council continues to encourage these opportunities.

2. The hearing aid system that we currently use has some issues and is frustrating for those who utilize it. A new system with improved technology is part of the 2014 ministry plan. In the mean time, the tech team will look at ways of making our current system function better.

3. The recent Teen Challenge service was discussed. Council received many positive comments and thanks for taking the initiative to have them lead one of our services. The power of the gospel to change lives is what our identity should be about. These young men and their families gave us an amazing glimpse of grace poured out and their stories were a testimony of praise to God.

4. Council discussed ways to improve how members are using their gifts and abilities as an act of worship within Bethany's ministries. A gift survey was floated as a meaningful way for the elders to identify potential areas of service with the members of Bethany. This will be looked at in the future.

5. Council discussed re-establishing an Outreach Ministry Team as a way of seeking out opportunities for the members and empowering us all to be a "God honouring community witnessing for Christ". More work will be done in this area in the upcoming meetings.
